Rare Plant Status Review Deletion of *Phacelia cinerea*

Nicholas Jensen (CNPS) and Roxanne Bittman (CNDDB) September 23, 2008

Background

Phacelia cinerea is currently on List 1A (plants presumed extinct in California) of the CNPS Inventory. The Jepson Manual (1993) treats P. cinerea as a synonym of P. distans. P. cinerea is known solely from the type collection on San Nicolas Island in 1901. Steve Junak (pers. comm. 2008) states that, "In the Flora of San Nicolas Island (just completed this year) I treated P. cinerea as a synonym of P. distans as well. I just could not distinguish the type specimen of P. cinerea from P. distans." Additionally, The Jepson Manual (2nd edition) will continue to treat P. cinerea as a synonym of P. distans (M. Wetherwax pers. comm. 2007). P. distans is a common taxon with more than 2000 specimens deposited in California Herbaria.

Consequently, CNPS and CNDDB recommend that *P. cinerea* be deleted from List 1A of the CNPS Inventory.

Recommended Actions

CNPS: Delete Phacelia cinerea from CNPS List 1A

CNDDB: Delete Phacelia cinerea from CNDDB, GXQ/SX
