Rare Plant Status Review: Taraxacum ceratophorum

Background

Taraxacum ceratophorum is known in California from only a single voucher specimen, which was recently annotated by Luc Brouillet (Flora North America author). This taxon has been treated as a variety of the common dandelion *T. officinale* but according to Brouillet and Baldwin's examinations of the specimen, it is definitely distinct and should be recognized as *T. ceratophorum*. This species was collected by Victor Duran in 1926 from Mono County near Cottonwood Creek in the White Mountains (9500'). The specimen label info can be viewed here:
