Rare Plant Status Review: Crataegus castlegarensis

Background

Crataegus castlegarensis (Castlegar hawthorne) was formally described as a new species in 2001 with a range including Washington, Oregon, Wyoming, Utah, Idaho, Montana, British Columbia and Alberta (Phipps & O'Kennon 2002, Sida 20:115-144). It is known in California from only four occurrences in Modoc and Shasta Counties, disjunct 350 km from the nearest recorded populations in Grant County, Oregon. The California occurrences are based solely on herbarium specimens dated 1893, 1899, 1940 and 1941(P. Zika, 2004, Madrono 51:395). The California records are known only from herbarium specimens and the current status of these occurrences is unknown. Peter Zika indicated that only RSA and POM specimens were examined, so there could be additional unannotated specimens of the species in other major herbaria. Crataegus castlegarensis would most often be confused with Crataegus douglasii from which it was separated. C. suksdorfii is apparently similar in morphology as well. Because significant questions regarding the rarity, status and threats remain, we have suggested placement on List 3. If we receive additional data regarding these factors, the species could meet the criteria for List 2. Because of its restricted distribution and the apparently small number of occurrences, the species requires review for inclusion in both the CNPS Inventory and the CNDDB.

Recommended Actions

CNPS: Add to CNPS List 3 (There is no threat rank because the Madrono article did not comment on threats for the California occurrences)

CNDDB: Add to CNDDB as G5 / S1S3

How rare is this species in CA? Need information on current status, rarity and threats. Not in The Jepson Manual. See Sida 20:121 (2002) for original description and Madrono 51:395(2004) for information on first report in California. Apparently widespread outside of California where it is known from WA, OR, MT, ID, UT, WY, British Columbia and Alberta. Can be confused with C. douglasii and C. suksdorfii.
