Rare Plant Status Review: *Delphinium scaposum*Misa Ward (CNPS) and Roxanne Bittman (CNDDB),
with assistance from Patrick McIntyre (CNPS Intern)
January 23, 2006

Background

Delphinium scaposum is a perennial herb previously known from Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Nevada and Utah. Distinguishing characteristics include its scapose stems and blue flowers. DeGroot published the first three California occurrences of *Delphinium scaposum* as a Noteworthy Collection in Madrono 52(2):125 (2005). All three California occurrences are located in the Whipple Mountains in San Bernardino County. DeGroot describes the occurrences as located on rocky slopes and the rocky banks of a wash. Associated species reported in the Madrono article include Larrea tridentata, Fouquieria splendens ssp. splendens, Encelia farinosa, Eriogonum fasiculatum var. polifolium, Eriogonum inflatum, Lycium andersonii, and Lycium fremontii. Of note is the observation that the California occurrences are from below the previously described lower elevation limit of 1200m for this species. Outside of California this species inhabits juniper woodlands, grasslands, rocky hillsides, mesas and open deserts in the Sonoran and Transition zones. There are no immediate threats known to its survival in California because it occurs in remote, infrequently visited areas. Although *Delphinium scaposum* is widespread outside of California in the desert Southwest, it is known in California from only three occurrences with fewer than 20 individuals total, and requires review for inclusion in both the CNPS Inventory and the CNDDB.
