### Rare Plant Status Review: Digitaria californica

## Background

Digitaria californica is a perennial bunchgrass in the Poaceae. Digitaria californica is known from Arizona, Colorado, Oklahoma, New Mexico, and Texas in the United States as well as from Mexico, Central America and South America. This species is not included in the Jepson Manual (1993); however, it is indicated as a possible new addition. Digitaria californica is described in the Noteworthy Collection of Madrono 52 (2005) as the first report and collection for California (specimen collected in October of 2003). This is significant as it extends the western range of the species. In addition, the Consortium of California Herbaria has a collection of this plant from San Bernardino County (specimen collected in November of 2005). This latter collection was made in the Eastern Mojave Desert near Rock Springs in San Bernardino County at an elevation of 1490 m; while the collection reported in Madrono was collected at 290 m elevation in Anza-Borrego Desert State Park in eastern San Diego County and consists of about 100 plants. In San Diego County, Digitaria californica is described as occurring on a rocky schist hillside; while populations of the species in other states generally occur on open plains. Associated species with the San Bernardino population include Mirabilis bigelovii, Prunus fasciculata, Achantherum speciosum, Erioneuron pulchellum, and Yucca schidigera. The collector of the Digitaria californica in San Bernardino County mentions recreational fire as a possible threat. In other states, *Digitaria* californica is considered a highly palatable pasture grass that is very resistant to grazing. Since Digitaria is known in California from only two occurrences it requires review for inclusion in both the CNPS Inventory and the CNDDB.

Perennial herb; blooms July to November. Known in California from only two occurrences in San Diego and San Bernardino Counties. See *Bot. Voy. Sulph. 55* (1881) for original description and *Madrono* 52(4): 271 (2005) for information on the first record in California.
