Rare Plant Status Review: Eriogonum prattenianum var. prattenianum

Background

Eriogonum prattenianum var. *prattenianum* is an endemic buckwheat distributed along the western slope of the northern and central Sierra Nevada. Both matted, perennial herb and erect shrub forms of plants exist in the range. This buckwheat is usually found on volcanic or granitic outcrops within ceanothus or manzanita chaparral, or within oak or montane conifer forests. It differs from variety *avium* (CNPS List 4) in its more northern distribution and leaves, which are tomentose on both surfaces. The available data indicate there are up to 26 documented occurrences of *E. prattenianum* var. *prattenianum*. Four of these are located in Nevada County on private property and threatened by proposed development and off-road vehicle use. Additional distribution and threat information is requested for this plant in the remainder of its range.

Karen Callahan, Redbud Chapter Rare Plant Coordinator, has led CNPS field trips to *E. prattenianum* var. *prattenianum* sites in Nevada County for several years and has proposed it as a new addition to the *Inventory* based on her experience with this plant. Please review Karen's summary document and the draft Inventory record below, and respond Yes or No on the proposal to add this taxon to the Inventory and CNDDB. Your edits, updated data or comments are greatly appreciated.
