Rare Plant Status Review: Fritillaria gentneri

BLM Botanist Joe Molter discovered the first California occurrence of *Fritillaria genteri*, just south of the Oregon border, near Brushy Creek in Siskiyou Co. This year, a second occurrence was found about a mile east of the first one. This range extension has been confirmed by knowledgeable botanists in Oregon, where this species is state-listed.

Perennial herb (bulbiferous), blooms April-May.

Known in California from only two occurrences. State-listed as Endangered in Oregon. Sympatric with *F. recurva*, which it superficially resembles. Not in *The Jepson Manual*. See *Madroño* 11:138 (1951) for original description.
