## Rare Plant Status Review: *Microseris laciniata* ssp. *detlingii* Kristi Lazar and Roxanne Bittman (CNDDB) October 16, 2006

## Background

*Microseris laciniata* ssp. *detlingii* is a perennial herb in the Asteraceae. *M. laciniata* ssp. *detlingii* is a newly described species known in California from a single occurrence in Siskiyou County, near the Oregon border (*SIDA* 21(1): 193-205 (2004)). This species is also known from southern Oregon and is considered a species of concern in that state. This subspecies was once known from only 3 occurrences in Oregon; however, Sue Vrilakas with the Oregon Natural Heritage Program says that there have been many more occurrences recently found in Oregon (53 occurrences currently). This particular subspecies occurs only in montmorillonite clay soil, which is characterized as being sticky when wet and hard and cracked when dry. This species can reproduce clonally and as mentioned in the SIDA article, "colonies are often limited to patches of loose soil turned up by gophers or squirrels". The habitat of the species is open hillsides, grasslands, and shrublands between 600 and 1500 meters in elevation.

Ken Chambers is the author of this taxon as well as the author for the new *Jepson Manual* treatment for *Microseris*. This subspecies will therefore be included in the new edition of The Jepson Manual. *M. laciniata* ssp. *detlingii* is known from 1 occurrence in California and requires review for inclusion in both the CNPS inventory and the CNDDB.
