Rare Plant Status Review: Pseudognaphalium leucocephalum

Background

Pseudognaphalium leucocephalum is a perennial herb in the Asteraceae. This species is known from approximately 23 occurrences in Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, and Santa Barbara Counties. The occurrences in Los Angeles County (Hollywood and Pasadena) are historical and the species may be extirpated from these localities. This species is also present in Arizona, New Mexico, and Mexico. This species is included in Jepson (1993) as Gnaphalium leucocephalum and in the Flora of North America as Pseudognaphalium leucocephalum. P. leucocephalum is the accepted name according to the Integrated Taxonomic Information System (ITIS) with G. leucocephalum being a synonym. This species can flower from July through December and occurs in areas of oak and pine woodlands as well as riparian vegetation from 50 to 2100 meters in elevation. In Southern California, P. leucocephalum is also known from coastal scrub and chaparral habitats.

P. leucocephalum is currently known in California from approximately 23 occurrences in coastal areas of Southern California. Due to the small number of occurrences in areas threatened by development and lack of information regarding historical occurrences, this species requires review for inclusion in both the CNPS Inventory and the CNDDB.
